MOST EFFECTIVE

1. ELIMINATION

2. SUBSTITUTION

3. ISOLATION

4. ENGINEERING

CONTROLS

You should always aim to eliminate WHS risks.

5. ADMINISTRATIVE CONTROLS 6. PPE

> LEAST EFFECTIVE
